

Rodrigues Protection of Produce Regulations, 1942

GN 12/1942

COURTS ACT

Regulations made by the Governor in Executive Council under articles 2 and 3 of Act No. 3 of 1881 to provide for the protection of the produce of Rodrigues.

1. These Regulations may be cited as The Rodrigues Protection of Produce Regulations, 1942.

2. The introduction into Rodrigues is prohibited of-

- (1) Any mongoose or any bulbul (*Pynonotus jocosus*).
- (2) Any mammal, reptile, insect or bird, without a permit from the Chief Agricultural Officer.
- (3) Any plant or any part thereof, of the following-

Raquette (*Opuntia* spp.)
Lantana (*Lantana* spp.).
Herbe Condé (*Cordia interrupta*);

- (4) Any live plant of any kind, unless accompanied by a certificate from the Chief Agricultural Officer, stating that such plant has been examined and found free of pests and diseases.
- (5) Plants, and cuttings belonging to the citrus family.

3. All plants and parts of plants (including fruit, tubers, cuttings and roots) shall be subject to inspection at Rodrigues, before entry is allowed, and it shall be competent for an officer of the Agricultural Department to order the disinfection or destruction of any such consignment or part thereof, if such consignment shall be found to be infected with any plant pest or disease.

4. Any person contravening, or attempting to contravene any of the above Regulation shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five hundred rupees, and to imprisonment 130t exceeding three months, Any animal, plant or part thereof including fruit, tubers and roots, being the subject matter of the contravention shall be forfeited by order of the Court and dealt with as au officer of the Agricultural department may direct.

5. The Regulations published under Government Notification No. 85 of 1923 are revoked.

Approved by the Governor in Executive Council on the ninth day of January, 1912, and ordered to come into force at once.
