RODRIGUES SALE OF CAKES AND PROVISIONS REGULATIONS 1923

GN 230/23 (Lane I/827) - section 158 - 27 August 1923

- 1. Short title
 - These regulations may be cited as the Rodrigues Sale of Cakes and Provisions Regulations 1923.
- 2. Cakes, etc. to be kept in closed cases or boxes

No cakes, sweets, barley sugar, bread, "macatias" or provisions or eatables of any kind ready for immediate consumption, with the exception of entire and unpeeled fresh fruits which are not usually eaten unpeeled, and of vegetables which are not usually eaten uncooked, shall be kept for sale in any shop or back shop or premises, or carried or hawked or exposed for sale otherwise than in perfectly clean and well closed cases or boxes arranged in such a way that no dust or flies can get into such cases or boxes when closed.

3. Unclean or noxious material not to be kept in cases or boxes

No unclean or noxious material, substance or article of any kind shall be kept in the same box or case with such provisions or eatables.

4. Cases or boxes - when to remain open

Such cases or boxes shall not remain open except during the time strictly necessary for the sale and delivery to customers of the articles contained in them.

- Exposure of vegetables, etc., on verandah of buildings, prohibited
 No vegetables, meat of any kind or fish shall be exposed for sale on the verandah of any building adjoining a street or thoroughfare.
- 6. Penalty

Any breach of the above regulations shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding 100 rupees.
